## Decker provides leadership in new communication position

Seeking to communicate a consistent and easily accessible message of Avenue Scholars' mission in the Omaha community, Lindsay Decker is embracing her new role as Director of Communications and Development.

Decker says her primary responsibility is to "oversee how we are communicating to constituents and main stakeholders — our community, our students, and our parents — how we keep that voice consistent, easy to access, and easily understandable through a marketing lens."

Coming from her previous role as Career Exploration Coordinator on the Business Outreach Team, Decker is well aware of how important her new job is in supporting all the Avenue Scholars departments — especially the High

School Career Coaches, Postsecondary Career Coaches, Business Outreach, and Intern Omaha — in their interactions with the community.

"For example, with the high school team getting ready to recruit the next cohort of students, I needed to consult with Michael Johnson (Assistant Director of Programs) to review what the plan was and how I can best support their plan to ensure the communication is consistent and easy to understand," Decker said.

On the Development side, Decker is tasked with

maintaining and building relationships with businesses and donors.

"It really is essentially about creating relationships with people and sustaining those relationships," Deck-

> er says. "We want to work with people who feel passionate about and inspired by the things we do."

Decker acknowledges that fundraising is part of that relationship building.

"If you're passionate about workforce development and giving back to the community through mentoring and internships, you will want to support Avenue Scholars in advancing the mission," she said. "It's that passion that I want to plug into."

Not coincidentally, Decker was recently accepted into Leadership Omaha's Class 45 (the forty-fifth year of the

program). A select group of 40 young leaders were chosen to participate in the 10-month program, which requires attending a monthly seminar where the class will be putting together projects to benefit the Omaha community.

"It's about building leaders, helping us flex our leadership strengths," Decker said. "I want to think people see me as leader by example, that they see something from me that inspires them and models for them a way to help make our city a wonderful place to live."

The students I'm working with are so eager to learn and participate in the programming, and the enthusiasm they have for being part of this inaugural class at Westside is palpable."
