The Avenue Scholars program provides an array of resources to help Scholars persist to career entry. Each Scholar is assigned a Career Coach at both the high school and postsecondary/career levels of the program to guide their personal and career-related development during the junior and senior years of high school (High School Career Coach) and during postsecondary training and into career entry (Postsecondary Career Coach). Scholars attending Metropolitan Community College (MCC) also receive

support from MCC College Success Navigators, who assist Scholars with college-related issues (course enrollment, financial aid, academic support, etc.). Additionally, the Avenue Scholars Business Outreach Team engages area businesses to provide career awareness, exploration, and employment opportunities, while the Avenue Scholars Student Support Staff provides group education and referrals to community resources to address life and social/emotional needs.

Financial and Personal Well-Being:






Timeline




2023: By the Numbers


ENROLLMENT FOR 2023-2024




PARTICIPANTS BY RACE, FALL 2023-24



Program Model

Since 2008, Avenue Scholars has provided individualized support

services to help Scholars of need identify, persist toward, and ultimately enter financially sustaining careers.

PHASE 1: HIGH SCHOOL

ELIGIBLE STUDENTS

Students are selected for the program during their sophomore year based on financial need (eligibility for free or reduced-price school lunches or a federal Pell Grant), interest in pursuing a career in a high-demand career field requiring an associate degree or less, and attendance at an Avenue Scholar partner high school.

PHASE 2: CAREER TRAINING (POSTSECONDARY)

AVENUE SCHOLARS POSTSECONDARY TRAINING GRANT

Avenue Scholars seniors who complete the high school phase of the program receive ongoing coaching, access to programming, and funding assistance to complete their education/training — up to an associate degree — with an approved Avenue Scholars postsecondary partner organization.

PHASE 3: CAREER ENTRY

Focused on high-demand, financially sustaining careers requiring an associate degree or less

Education Partners

Founded in 2008 by a small group of Omaha philanthropists, Avenue Scholars provides comprehensive, individualized support to help Omaha-area youth of financial need identify, prepare for, and ultimately enter financially sustaining, highdemand careers requiring career training or continuing education. Support begins in the Scholars' junior year of high school and continues uninterrupted through postsecondary education/training and for six months following career entry.

Scholars are selected for the program based on financial need (eligibility for free or reduced-price school lunches or a federal Pell Grant), interest in pursuing a career in a high-demand career field requiring career training or continuing education, and attendance at an Avenue Scholars partner high school. As of the fall of 2023, Avenue Scholars is serving Scholars in 11 partner high schools across six school districts:





