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## First Scholar Completes Metro's Commercial Driver's License Program

From a young age, Beh Kar, a Thailand native and Omaha Northwest High School graduate, was drawn to a career in truck driving, inspired by his family's history in the trade. After relocating to the U.S. at age one due to civil unrest in Thailand, Beh pursued his aspirations and became the first Avenue Scholar to complete the Commercial Driver's License (CDL) program at Metropolitan Community College (MCC), specializing in manual transmission.

Beh's internship at Woodhouse Auto Family further solidified his ambition to one day launch his own trucking or automotive business. Tonya Fairgood, his Postsecondary Career Coach, praises Beh's determination and passion for the CDL program, noting his discipline and business-minded approach. His High School Career Coach noticed the same when he started at Woodhouse.

"He was very verbal about his goal to be successful at Woodhouse. He advocated for himself when he needed additional tools. He called me to say, 'I really don't like borrowing tools from other people. I want to get my own. Can you all help me with that?'

This collaboration offers them a pathway through paid on-the-job training, starting wages at \$17 an hour, and chances for career advancement, addressing both an industry need and supporting youth in their career development.

Layla Turner, a Benson High School alum, exemplifies the success of this partnership. Now a full-time Dental Assistant at Summit, she's not only gained valuable work experience but also aims to progress to a Dental Hygienist, encouraged by the tuition reimbursement offered by Summit for further education.

"Summit does offer amazing benefits and pay for schooling so you can achieve your goals," Layla attests. Her journey from high school to the professional world was significantly supported by her Career Coach Terrence Gillian and Postsecondary Career Coach Canei Rodriquez, reflecting the comprehensive support system Avenue Scholars provides its Scholars.

Avenue Scholars facilitated Layla's certification as a Dental Assistant, introducing her to potential employment at Summit. There, she found not just a job but a supportive community, and this environment has been instrumental in her training and professional growth.

Two standout Scholars are Omaha Westside senior Angela "Angie" Ayika, and Omaha Bryan senior Noemie Olmedo. Angie's venture, Angel's Beauty, showcases her creativity through handmade bracelets and lip gloss products, originating from Westside's entrepreneurial Hatch program. With ambitions of expanding into a full-service beauty and salon business, Angie's journey is one of perseverance and strategic planning.

"I have a plan for almost everything I want to do," Angie said, highlighting her resilience and forward-thinking mindset. Beth Leach, her High School Career Coach, praises Angie's transformation and dedication: "She really turned her life around... She's disciplined, puts in the work, believes in herself, and trusts her ability, and that's what it's all about." Angie attributes a significant part of her growth to the Avenue Scholars program. "Avenue Scholars means a lot to me. It's helped me grow as an entrepreneur by supporting me in every step I take. My coaches let me know nothing comes easy, and I must set myself up for success. I love how Avenue Scholars always supports me whenever there's a business opportunity."

Noemie Olmedo, through her business Mimis Flores, creates handcrafted decorative floral arrangements with roses from Ecuador, drawing inspiration from her great-greatgrandfather's passion for flowers. Since the age of 15, Noemie has envisioned opening her own South Omaha storefront by age 20. Her business acumen and academic discipline are commendable, as she balances her growing enterprise with schoolwork, ensuring excellence in both. Kamina Lemons, Noemie's High School Career Coach, notes her transformation into a confident leader: "Where before she was very quiet, she's grown into this leader. She's very vocal and confident."

Driven by his family's journey and his own aspirations, Beh is relentless in pursuing his goals, emphasizing the importance of determination and self-advocacy. His commitment was evident in his approach to the CDL program, where he received significant support from his instructor, Reggie Patrick, and his classmates. Michael Kuebler, MCC's Professional Truck Driver Training Program Director, commends Beh's performance and motivation throughout the program, underscoring his potential in the trucking industry.

Beh's achievement as the inaugural Scholar to complete the program not only fills him with pride but also sets an example for his siblings and other Scholars. He credits MCC's efforts to remove barriers to entry for the program's accessibility and anticipates more Scholars will follow his path.

With a clear vision for his future, Beh is drawn to trucking for the freedom and independence it offers, along with the potential for a substantial entry-level salary with minimal debt. Meanwhile, Beh's given Avenue Scholars another success story to share with students.

According to his High School Career Coach, "Beh's in a position to get paid all this money to see the country because he followed the path we lined up. I have a couple juniors interested in getting their CDL to be able to drive the big truck, so this is a story I can give them. I can tell them this can be you a year-and-a-half from now. Better yet, Beh can tell them himself. It will be more powerful coming from him anyway. I will be asking him to talk to my class."

Looking ahead, Beh aims for a simple life, including traveling, possibly visiting Thailand, and eventually starting his own business. His story, now a part of Avenue Scholars' success narratives, serves as inspiration for future Scholars interested in pursuing a CDL and a career in trucking.

"I recommend Avenue Scholars. It's a very good program," Beh said. "You don't have anything to lose participating in it. They offer you a lot of good opportunities and resources for your future career."
